## Background and overview

This is an on-paper assessment for initial accreditation of a packaged Level 2 and 3 program, leading to a Master of Professional Psychology at the Australian National University (ANU). An exit degree at the end of Level 2 is provided in the form of a Graduate Diploma of Professional Psychology if required. Students are currently enrolled in the Level 2 program. Designed in part to avoid future workforce issues as the 4+2 program is retired, both components of the combined program have been designed to offer a solid foundation in the theory and practice of professional psychology, providing the opportunity in future to gain registration through the 5+1 pathway.

The proposed program is based on a face to face teaching format, at the Canberra Campus.



## Key findings

The proposed program meets the majority of the criteria of the APAC Standards. As the program is still in the planning stages, some Standards and criteria will require further monitoring to ensure that the program continues to run in the way envisaged, and for a subset of these a site visit will be required.



## APAC Board determination

That the Australian National University's **Graduate Diploma of Professional Psychology** (Level 2) (Campus: Canberra) program is accredited without conditions from **1 June 2020** until **31 December 2022**. *\*exit degree only*

That the Australian National University's **Master of Professional Psychology** (packaged Level 2 and 3) (Campus: Canberra) is accredited from **1 June 2020** until **31 December 2022** subject to the following conditions:

By **31 January 2021**:

1. To ensure Standard 1 Public safety, criterion 1.5 is met, the School is to submit evidence demonstrating that clients' informed consent is obtained prior to receiving services from a provisionally registered psychologist.
2. To ensure Standard 1 Public safety, criterion 1.6 is met, the School is to submit evidence demonstrating that the processes in place to ensure students have gained all relevant checks and registration requirements prior to beginning the Level 3 component of the program are appropriate.

By **30 June 2021**:

3. To ensure Standard 1 Public safety, criteria 1.9 and 1.10 and Standard 3 Program of study, criterion 3.7 are met, the School is to submit copies of completed student logbooks to show students achieve minimum number of placement hours, direct client hours, client related hours and supervision hours appropriately.
4. To ensure Standard 2 Academic governance and quality assurance, criteria 2.2, 2.3, 2.4 and 2.5 are met, the School is to submit evidence demonstrating that the relevant governance and quality assurance processes have been met.
5. To ensure Standard 5 Assessment, criterion 5.1 is met, the School is to submit evidence demonstrating that the application of the principles of inter-professional learning and practice (criterion 3.9) are being assessed within the program. In addition, examples of the Level 3 research capstone experience is required to ensure that *Professional Competency 3.17* is met.

As a monitoring requirement, a site visit is to be undertaken when the first cohort of students has completed at least six months of the Level 3 component of the program to ensure that the program is being implemented as intended and continues to meet the Accreditation Standards.
